
"On Friday, Oct. 23, we will be having a Grand

Much of the success of College Bound AZ is a direct result of the hard and relentless work of Elizabeth Paulus, executive director of College Bound AZ.

Unfortunately, the dream of higher education is too often crushed for deserving students. After her foreign exchange student from Brazil returned home to her country in 2009 — leaving behind a dear friend she had made in high school -Elizabeth witnessed first-hand how a senior in high school can be challenged financially to



fulfill their dream of attending college.

Elizabeth quickly observed the complex obstacles this bright young lady faced as she tried to fill out financial aid paperwork for college admission."Not only was the language barrier complex," said Elizabeth, "but recording the family income in the application was a real eye-opener. I learned even more as I stayed engaged throughout her first year of college."

The lesson for Elizabeth continued with the realization that the path to college was difficult with hidden obstacles sure to derail an unsuspecting student. She found this realization troubling because of the loss of human potential. She knew that without intervention, this very bright young lady would have met failure.

Elizabeth knew that children like these deserved better. This was the turning point; she decided something needed to be done to help students in these situations.

After initially partnering with Mesa United Way and then implementing The 6-Step Critical Path (found on their website collegebound.org), the student assistance organization branched to Mesa high schools and then leveraged into Arizona State University's Promise Program. Elizabeth, who earned her master's degree in education leadership, together with her husband, founded College Bound AZ to assist and support low-income students wanting to attend college.

The economic downturn caused

several sponsors to decline their contributions to the event this year, but other sponsors stepped in to fill the gaps. One of those contributors, local State Farm agent Matt Watson, is sharing the College Bound vision to turn dreams into degrees.

He has provided a golf package for four, compliments of The Fountain of the Sun Country Club in Mesa. This package includes lessons from a golf pro and a new golf bag. "Matt has an amazing heart for this community," says Elizabeth. "It's hard to express how much his generosity means."

## **SDA Betters the Best Through the Kindergarten Program**

ny day at Self Development Academy's advanced kindergarten program is special. But not like this past Thursday.

It was 7:30 in the morning on Thursday, Sept. 17. Wearing their brand new, crisp uniforms, their hair neatly styled, and their eyes glowing with excitement, the kindergarteners at Self Development Academy - Mesa (SDA) eagerly arrived for their in-person learning. The morning routine was a little different from the past years.

As the cars pulled up to the curb and while still in their cars, their temperatures were taken by the staff. Fixing their colorful masks, one more

time, these adorable kindergarteners confidently stepped out of their cars. A true warm and welcoming committee of staff members gave them air-hugs and melodically chanted, "So excited to see you." The youngsters walked to the gate, while carefully maintaining the social distance among themselves, to be greeted by their loving teachers, including Mrs. Haschke.

Once again, as in the past, Sharing and Caring emerged as a critical component of the kindergarten culture. However, a few new procedures were added, including how

# Mesa CARES Created to **MEET COMMUNITY NEEDS**

By Councilmember David Luna, Mesa District 5 hope you all are safe and well as we adjust to this new normal. While many things have unfolded since early



March, and the City of Mesa has undergone several changes, I would like to take this opportunity to provide an update on the Mesa CARES initiative.

In April, the City of Mesa launched the Mesa CARES initiative by creating the Mesa CARES community resources call center. Hosted and managed by the Mesa Public Library, the call center has over 100 City employees reassigned to the program. A phone line was open seven days a week from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The call center has become a reliable source of Mesa-based information for residents and businesses; connecting community members to available services. Currently, the call center is open Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and can be reached at (480) 644-CARE (2273).



To help with remote or distance learning, the City of Mesa allocated approximately \$7 million from Mesa CARES funding to provide technology assistance to K-6 students in Mesa. Approximately 9,000 laptop devices are being purchased for those Mesa students.

As part of the Mesa CARES initiative, the City also created the Feeding Mesa canned food drives. Residents were asked to donate canned goods and other non-perishable food items in a series of drive-through donation events throughout the City of Mesa over several weeks.

Employees from the Mesa Parks, **Recreation and Community Facilities** and Mesa Fire and Medical departments worked to support United Food Bank, Midwest Food Bank and other nonprofit agencies to coordinate the food drives. These collections help many individuals and families needing food assistance during these challenging times.

The Mesa CARES initiative continues to support individuals, families, and businesses impacted by COVID-19. Funding comes from the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act. For additional information and available resources, please visit mesaaz.gov/mesacares.

### **TRY LEARNING TOGETHER**

### **USE YOUR WISDOM AND LIFE EXPERIENCES**

# Will the Housing Market Crash like it Did in 2008?


Even with COVID 19, record unemployment, and the uncertainty of an upcoming election, there is nothing that indicates that the Phoenix metro housing market isn't going to continue to remain strong. Things may slow and prices level out, which wouldn't be a bad thing, as we can't keep going at the pace we have been.

The current median sales price has increased 16 percent from the same time last year. We don't expect the frenzy we are in now to continue into next year, but we don't expect the market to stop either — just slow down and get back to a more normal pace.

The crash of 2008 was caused by a global financial crisis, resulting in a housing bubble. Due to deregulation in the financial industry, banks were able to engage in hedge fund trading and demanded more mortgages to support this profitable side of the business. Subprime borrowers were given interest-only loans in order to be able to qualify and many unqualified borrowers were given loans they would never be able to repay. In a nutshell, if you could breath you could get a loan.

As soon as supply started to outpace demand, housing prices started plummeting. The bubble had burst, leaving many homeowners unable to make their balloon payments, upside down on their mortgages, and with no way to sell their homes.

Jump to 2020 and our housing market is completely the opposite of how it was in 2008. The financial industry is now heavily regulated and as anyone who has purchased a home since then will tell you, getting a mortgage is a lot more cumbersome. Lenders are required to verify that



borrowers have the ability to repay a loan and provide proof of income and assets.

Home prices are continuing to increase and prices are driven by supply and demand. While we expect the market to soften once the government stimulus packages are gone, some of the furloughed workers become unemployed, and foreclosures are filed again, we have such an imbalance of supply and demand that the Arizona housing market is expected to remain strong. More buyers are flocking to Arizona, new home builders cannot build fast enough to keep up with the increase in population, and Maricopa remains the No. 1 growing county in the U.S. The charts here show the difference in our market today versus 2008.

### low do Elections Affect OCK MARKF ST Y INVESTING BASED ON POLITICS CAN BE A BIG MISTAKE

hey say that the majority of Americans don't tune into politics during an election year until after Labor Day. This may be why the financial media is now in overdrive with TV advice on how to position your investment portfolio if one candidate or political party wins over the other.

Whether you lean left or right, I know that many of you are very passionate about politics. One of the most common questions or concerns that we hear from 401(k) participants or wealth management clients relates to the short and long-term impact on the stock market that this year's presidential election may have. Fortunately, there is data going back to the 1920s which provides us with a clear picture of how markets are impacted by elections. The answer is that elections have had very little short-term impact, and virtually no long-term impact on market returns.


Here is a chart which shows the growth of a dollar invested in the S&P 500 under presidential administrations going back to 1926. It turns out that the stock market has consistently gone up over time regardless of which party controls the White House.

This tells us that investing based on politics has historically been a bad idea. The future expected return for equities (stocks) is always positive and companies will adapt quickly to any political, regulatory, or tax

environment to stay profitable. Attempting to jump in and out of the market in your investment portfolios based on election results almost always leads to market underperformance and a likely reduction in the future value of your investment assets.

Amazingly, after some 43,000 trips, Tim says there have only been five instances where they had a glitch. "Believe it or not, I still have the receipt tickets for every one of those 43,000 trips stored in my attic. I've had some of my clients for over 10 years — neighbors, local business people and lots of Boeing employees. I live right here in Las Sendas and over the years they've become my friends."


