As the leader in LASIK procedures, Dr. Schwartz provides his expertise from his three Valley centers in Mesa, Scottsdale and Glendale. Dr. Schwartz also trains other surgeons nationally and around the world.

From these locations, including one right here in Mesa at 3130 E. Baseline Road, the Schwartz Laser Eye Center's highly trusted team of ophthalmologists and optometrists offer advanced treatments and surgical options for their patients. Services include customized LASIK, Epi-LASIK, multiple cataract lens options, and treatment for many eye diseases, including glaucoma and dry eyes.

In addition, comprehensive routine eye examinations for contact lenses, glasses, or just general eye health are performed at all three facilities.

I had the opportunity to ask Dr. Schwartz about agerelated eye conditions, care, as well as candidacy for various procedures and here's what he had to say.

AT WHAT AGE SHOULD SOMEONE BEGIN **RECEIVING ROUTINE EYE EXAMS?**

Routine eye exams should begin with children, ages 8 to 18. These are the years thought of as primary care for the eyes. During this time parents should schedule regular eye exams, encourage healthy eating, and help children protect their eyes against sun damage.

Early treatment of eye problems can help prevent long term issues later in life. This is especially true when it comes



to the need for glasses and contact lenses.

AT WHAT AGE DOES SOMEONE BEGIN TO EXPE-RIENCE ISSUES WITH VISION? People can experience

vision issues at any age, however from ages 18 to 40 we often see a stabiliza-

tion of glasses and contact lens prescriptions. From ages 40 to 65, we start to see diseases that can affect the eyes. Systemic diseases can and often do have eye manifes-

tations, so it's never too early to look for those things in routine examinations. Presbyopia issues generally begin to appear in young adults after age 40. This causes a need for reading glasses

in someone who otherwise has very good vision. Diseases such as diabetes, glaucoma, hypertension,

and cataracts — just to name a few — all can start to affect the eye after 40. The issues can get worse with age so annual checkups at this time is a must.

WHAT IS PRESBYOPIA?

Presbyopia is caused by a hardening of the lens of the eye which naturally occurs with aging. As the lens of the eye becomes less flexible, it is no longer able to change shape to focus on close-up images. This generally happens around the age of 40 and continues to worsen until around the age of 65.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF LASIK **PROCEDURES?**

LASIK corrects nearsightedness, farsightedness, and astigmatism, which are refractive errors caused by irregularly shaped or curved corneas.

The goal of LASIK is to reshape the cornea, so it alters the way light enters the eye and vision becomes sharper and more focused.

WHO IS A GOOD CANDIDATE FOR LASIK?

Lasik can be done at almost any age, ranging from 18 to 100, however it's not always the right option for everyone. Someone in the same age group may need a different procedure like an ICL — a contact lens that can be implanted into the eye to correct very high levels of nearsightedness and astigmatism.

Similarly, patients aged 46 to 65 may be great LASIK candidates or alternatively might be better off with a clear lens exchange. Removing the natural lens in favor of an artificial lens can help restore near and intermediate vision along with distance vision as opposed to a LASIK procedure that may only restore distance or a more compromised monovision type of correction (one eye sees far while the other sees near).

Having a comprehensive exam as well as a thorough discussion will help determine what is the best way to proceed.

WHEN DO CATARACTS GENERALLY BEGIN **TO APPEAR?**

Patients 65 and up often have cataracts. These patients may be able to have the same technology we use for clear lens exchanges to allow for near, intermediate, and far vision. Often, insurance helps to cover some of the cost.

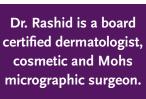

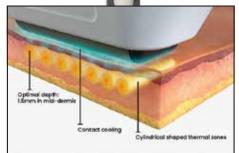

Self Development Academies Unleashes CURIOSITY TO SOLVE COMMUNITY PROBLEMS

There is no doubt that two people sharing similar hardships and entitlements, sharing zip codes, even genetics, can have radically different experiences when it comes to their education.

The world surrounding these youngsters has not offered them chances to challenge themselves. There are no clocks without sentimental value for them to take apart. No large problems that have not yet been fixed.

This has struck us hard at Self Development Academy because like every school in the country, we worry about the learning of our gifted, or dismissive, or avoidant, and the class clowns. We are also concerned about the parents who are working hard to ensure that their children are receiving not only high-quality education but also a nurturing and caring environment.

Last year, during the pandemic, we began what we called Community Swaps. We saw an imbalance and decided to correct it. Those with time on their hands gave to those without items such as food, toilet paper and other necessities, because their convenience store was not as convenient anymore.

We bring this up because, while certainly, we can hug loved ones, there is so much more work that needs to be



done. We bring this up because Self Development Academy exists for the community, composed of individuals and their wonderful differences. The differences we notice is when the gifted child who amazingly not only puts the antique clock back together but was able to have it tell time again.

Gifted children are not merely satisfied with reflective pride — by this we mean, pride beaming upon someone like a ray of sun. We owe them and our community the chance to lead lives of motivated curiosity embedded deep inside the patriotic heart of civic duty.

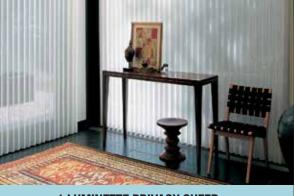

Is The Housing Market Softening?

veryone is talking about the ★ housing market softening, ✓ but what does that really mean? After a booming housing market in the past year with recordlow inventory and soaring home

prices, it looks like the market is finally starting to soften. But don't mistake this as the start of a crash or even home prices coming down. We use the word soften very lightly, as the market is just starting to soften but we are still in a very strong seller's market.

PRICE REDUCTIONS

As we see inventory beginning to increase, we have started to see an uptick in price reductions. In a normal market, we will see around 400 to 500 price reductions a week in the greater Phoenix area, so we are still way below that at only 200 a week in July, but it is increasing and a change from the market just a few months ago.

It's not only the added supply that has created price reductions, but some sellers who overprice their homes

mistakenly thinking they can ask way above the current market value. That may have been the case a few months ago, but certainly not now.

Finally, you can breathe a little sigh of relief as the inventory starts to increase and buyers are not as eager to get into bidding wars and pay way above the asking price. Don't get me wrong, we are still seeing bidding wars, just not as often and with fewer multiple offers.

If it's a great house priced well, you will likely still have to bid above asking and be competitive, but the craziness is definitely starting to wain and more realistic prices and terms are coming back.

SELLERS

The key in the current market is not to overprice your home from the start. The last thing you want to do in any market but especially today's market is having to do price reductions. This gives a red flag to buyers that there is something wrong with the house or it was overpriced to begin with, and they may offer below your current price.

The key in this market is to sell as quickly as possible and still get multiple offers. If you are planning to sell anytime in the near future, now might be the best time

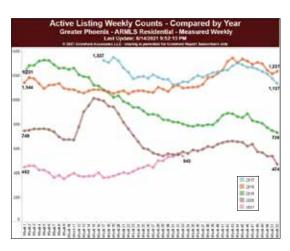

njoy a floating beach blast adventure on the Lower Salt River in September. Chill out and shoot the rocking Salt River rapids on a tube while beating the heat and enjoying fun in the sun.

"Enjoy a leisurely float on the cool and inviting mountain stream waters and catch glimpses of the diverse wildlife including blue herons and the Salt River wild horses. Our recreational paradise is the coolest ride to enjoy fun in the sun during September," said Salt River Tubing President and CEO Henri Breault. "Floating in the mini-Grand Canyon of Tonto National Forest is a unique and memorable experience in the great outdoors."

Salt River Tubing is open Friday, Saturday, and Sunday in September from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. until Sept. 26. The latest tube rental is 1 p.m., weather and water flow permitting. The cost is only \$19 plus tax per person or tube, which includes tube rental, shuttle bus ride, and free customer parking at Salt River Tubing.

Shooting the Salt River rapids is great fun, and company officials recommend the following helpful tubing tips to assist tubers in planning their floating beach blasts:



- A valid driver's license is required for a tube rental deposit per five tubes rented.
- Children must be at least eight years or older and four feet tall for tubing and shuttle bus service.
- Life vests are strongly recommended for children, non-swimmers, and inexperienced swimmers.
- Glass containers by law are not allowed in the Salt River Recreational Area. Ice chests will be inspected for glass containers before boarding shuttle buses. Please use plastic bottles or aluminum can containers.
- Have a great time during your floating beach blasts, but remember that drugs, alcohol, and the Salt River do not mix. Responsibly appoint a designated driver before your tubing adventure.
- Floating picnic ideas include fresh fruit, burritos, fried chicken or sandwiches.
 Pack picnic items in Ziploc bags to keep dry. Please stash and bag all picnic supplies in litter bags while floating.
- Sun block, tennis shoes, and cap or visor should be worn. A minimum 30 SPF is recommended.
- Ice chest/coolers: Fill with ice, sport drinks, fruit juice and water. One to two bottles of water per hour while floating is recommended to help prevent dehydration.

Set Your Child Up for Success with a **DEDICATED LEARNING SPACE**

new school year is just around the corner—exciting for kids who are looking forward to in-person learning, and a welcome break for you.

The beginning of school also brings with it that unavoidable essential: homework.

One way to help turn homework into a positive experience is by having a designated area for homework in your home. Carving out a spot conveys that homework is important, which is essential for keeping your child motivated and on track.

Ready to set up a homework hub? The following pointers ensure it will make the grade.

- Start with peace and quiet. Choose a low-traffic area of your house to avoid distractions like siblings, video games and the TV. Even an out-of-the-way corner of the living room will work.
- Light it up. Natural light is energizing, making a space next to a window ideal (although you'll need to balance the perks of natural light with potential distractions from outside). An adjustable desk lamp and good overhead lighting are also key to minimizing strain on your child's eyes.
- Make it comfortable. Your child should be able to put his feet flat on the floor when he sits in his chair. If the chair is too high, place a footstool or shoebox under his feet. His work surface should be about waist-high (he should be able to rest his elbows on the table without hunching up his shoulders).

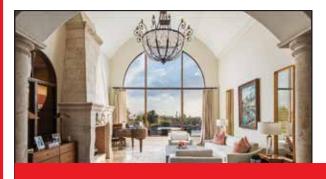

ANDROPAUSE: What Is It and What Can Be Done?

en experience a decline in hormones as they age. This process is called andropause or testicular hypogonadism. Andropause is the decline of male hormones called androgens. Androgens are hormones responsible for



male development and sexual function. They are mainly testosterone and androstenedione.

Andropause is usually a slower process of hormone decline in men than menopause in women, who experience sudden and unpleasant plunges of hormone levels.

What are the warning signs of andropause? Because andropause is usually a gradual process declining over a few decades, men may experience lower sex drive, decreased morning erections and erectile dysfunction, mood swings, irritability, tiredness, and even hot flashes.

According to the Mayo Clinic, other possible symptoms include decreased energy, motivation and confidence, depressed mood, and poor concentration. It is also possible to experience increased sleepiness, sleep disturbances, mild unexplained anemia, reduced muscle bulk and strength,



and increased body fat. More information can be found at mayoclinic.org/healthy-lifestyle/mens-health/in-depth/ male-menopause/art-20048056.

Men sometimes may blame themselves, thinking that they are doing something wrong and should be doing better in their lives when in actuality it may be a physical problem caused by the decline in their testosterone, suddenly causing havoc in their lives. It can be depressing, and no one talks about it.

Abdulmaged M. Traish, PhD, Emeritus Professor of Urology at Boston University School of Medicine, is a proponent for sexual health among men and women. He wrote Negative Impact of Testosterone Deficiency and 5α-Reductase Inhibitors Therapy on Metabolic and Sexual Function in Men. "Androgen deficiency is a well-recognized medical condition and if remained untreated can have a negative impact on human health and quality of life. In this chapter, we have summarized the negative impact of testosterone deficiency on a host of physiological functions including reduced lean body mass, increased fat mass, increased insulin resistance, metabolic syndrome and adiposity, reduced bone mineral density, anemia, sexual dysfunction, and reduced quality of life and increased mortality."

So, what can be done about assessing and treating andropause? A good intake including family history, stressors, diet and lifestyle will be discussed. Blood tests will be run to determine general health and hormone levels including thyroid function and diabetes assessment. Then bioidentical testosterone replacement will be discussed. Forms of testosterone replacement are gels, injections and pellets.

Could your decline in health be caused by low testosterone? Are you blaming your lack of motivation on something psychological when it could be a genuine physical problem that can be easily addressed? Why not come in and visit with me and let's see if we can get you feeling better.

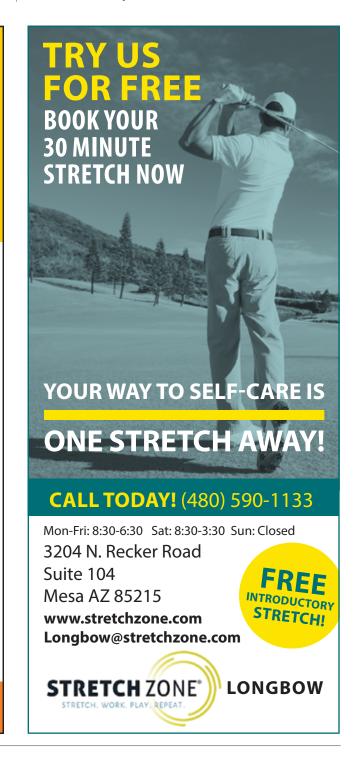

The Changing Face of Retirement

f you're worried that Social Security and Medicare L benefits will be reduced or even eliminated by the time you retire, you are not alone. Reports in the news have created some anxiety and some confusion about their stability and how

these important programs might change.

Social Security was never meant to be the only source of income for retirees. It was meant to be part of a threelegged stool of income sources for retirees: Social Security, pensions, and savings.

Social Security is funded through mandatory contributions from workers and their employers. Workers pay 6.2 percent of their earnings, up to a cap of \$137,700. Employers pay a matching amount. Self-employed workers pay both the employee and the employer share for a 12.4 percent total.

These contributions are held by special trust funds that were established to pay Social Security and Medicare benefits and administrative expenses. Any trust fund assets that aren't needed to meet current costs are invested in special issue U.S. government securities.

You can start receiving Social Security retirement benefits as early as age 62, but your benefits are decreased by about one-half of one percent for each month you start receiving benefits before your full retirement age. Your full retirement age depends on the year you were born. If you were born before 1955, your full retirement age is 66. If you were born after 1959, your full retirement age is 67. If you delay receiving benefits beyond your full retirement age — up until age 70 — you will receive credits that increase your monthly benefits.

The total benefits you receive depend on these calcula-

tions, along with your earning's history. The maximum monthly Social Security benefit anyone can earn in 2020 is \$3,790, and that's for someone who files at age 70.

The good news is that we're living longer. When the Social Security Act was passed in 1935, the average life expectancy was 61 years old. The Social Security Administration now estimates that a 65-year-old today can be expected to live, on average, another 20 years.

Members of the Baby Boom generation — those born from 1946 to 1965 — have been, and will continue to be, reaching retirement age. By 2035, the number of Americans 65 and older will increase from today's figure of approximately 56 million to more than 78 million.

In the year 2035, the oldest Baby Boomers will be 89, and the youngest 70. By 2035, mandatory contributions will be enough to pay for only 75 percent of scheduled Social Security benefits.

An important reason for the projections that Social Security will not be able to meet all of its obligations by 2035 is lower birth rates. The CDC reported that births in 2018 hit the lowest number in 32 years.



There's no shortage of proposals for fixing issues that are likely to impact Social Security benefits for senior citizens. Changes that are now being discussed include:

- Increasing the full retirement age to 70, trimming cost-of-living adjustments,
- · Reducing benefits for wealthier retirees,
- Diverting a percentage of payroll taxes from retiree benefits to private accounts, and
- Investing Social Security trust funds in the stock market. There are pros and cons to each of these proposals,

depending on your point of view. The most controversial are those that propose investing Social Security trust funds in the stock market, or diverting contributions to private security accounts. Proponents argue that investing Social Security assets could significantly increase returns. Opponents argue that inherent market risk could deprive some retirees of the security that Social Security was created to provide.

We can expect to hear much more on these proposals in the future.

relative and hear all kinds of advice. While most of the advice is partially

correct, there are so many conditions and exceptions that I thought I would take an opportunity to give some clarity.

Here are five important facts about getting started with Medicare:

- 1. Some people get Medicare automatically and some people have to sign up. You may have to sign up if you are 65 or about to turn 65 and not getting Social Security.
- 2. If you are covered by an employer plan and want to continue on with the employer plan after 65, you can delay your Medicare Part B without incurring a penalty provided the employer plan is credible coverage and includes RX coverage.

- 3. There are certain times of the year when you can sign up or change how you get your Medicare coverage. One of those opportunities is right around the corner. Medicare Annual Enrollment is from Oct. 15 through Dec. 7. This is an opportunity to review your current plan and possibly choose a new plan.
- 4. You can choose how you get your Medicare coverage, either by original Medicare with a supplement and part D plan or enrolling in an Advantage plan.
- 5. You may be able to get help with your Medicare costs if you are low income. Most of the commercials on TV that advertise getting your part B reimbursed only apply to Medicare recipients who have limited income.

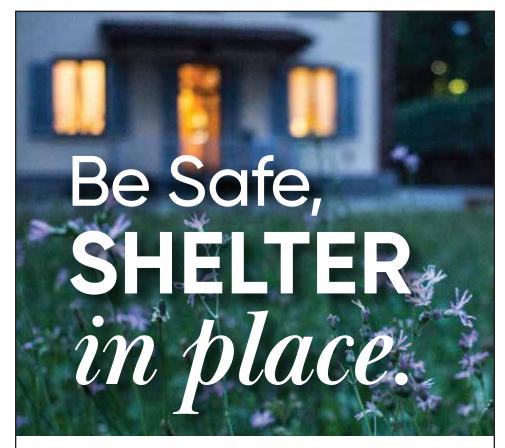

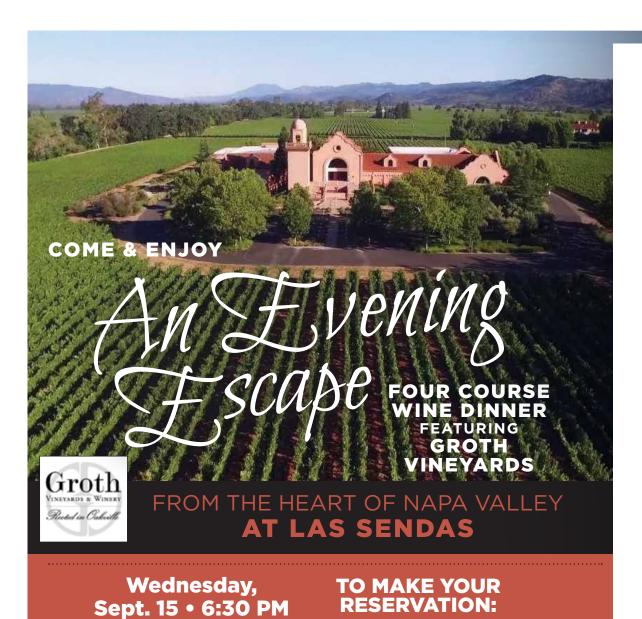
