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# At Self Development, Early Math Matters

## WHAT IS EARLY MATH LITERACY AND WHY IS IT IMPORTANT

"It was a bittersweet day when my child graduated 8th grade from Self Development Academy (SDA) last week. It was exciting to see him go on to the next chapter in his life, but it meant his time at SDA was over. He has attended SDA since he was a toddler at Self Development Preschool. SDA has given him the knowledge he needs to be successful as he moves on. He will be attending a large, public high school in their STEM diploma program. He is prepared and will be taking Honors Algebra II and Honors Biology among his classes as a freshman. Thank you, SDA, for preparing my son for the next chapter in his life." — written by a parent of a former student

t Self Development Preschool and Academy, we take early math literacy seriously. We recognize the critical role of math literacy for school success and beyond. Our math curriculum is aligned both vertically and horizontally from preschool to grade 8, an extraordinary feature of an excellent educational program.

Math literacy is not just counting numbers or memorizing the names of the geometrical shapes or formulas. Math literacy is the ability to problem-solve, use critical thinking, logic, and reasoning, and evaluate and analyze information.

The early math literacy program at Self Development Preschool and Academy supports the development of mathematical thinking from ages two years old to 8 years, from preschool to second grade. The philosophy of the highly rigorous curriculum even at the preschool level is researchbased and relies on several assumptions and beliefs.

First, mathematical thinking helps children become critical thinkers, which brings meaning and an understanding of their everyday experiences. The enjoyment of the process of learning early math lays the foundation for later success. In upper elementary grades, they excitedly claim, "We love math. Math is easy."



Second, early math literacy is critical to early childhood education. By beginning with simple concepts and moving to more complex thinking, young children develop the skills of mathematical and methodical thinking through play. At the preschool age, as children develop their self-concept, they rely on their preferences, what they like and what they don't.

Third, developing a love and understanding of math in the early years requires effective teaching strategies. Unfortunately, research shows that most preschools are not teaching math skills. Teaching math is almost non-existent in most early childhood programs, with one study noting that less than a minute a day was spent in preschools.

Effective math teaching emphasizes the important concepts in math and explains the why of those concepts.

The early math literacy program at SDA helps students connect new ideas to the concepts with which they are already familiar and nurtures students to develop a deeper understanding of mathematical ideas. Students become problem-solvers.

#### **DEVELOPING THE NUMBER SENSE**

In many early childhood programs, the most popular method of teaching mathematics is by rote counting, similar to singing the alphabet. However, learning to count may teach children number words and the order of numbers but does not develop a number sense.

Number sense is the ability to understand the quantity of a set of items and the name associated with that quantity. Children progress past repetitive counting and are able to count logically, by relating one number to each item, using the correct sequence. This understanding of the number of items is called one-to-one correspondence. Young children count the objects one at a time and are able to answer how many objects are in the set.

At SDA, the focus on the development of a strong number sense in the early years lays the foundation for excelling in mathematics in elementary school by connecting counting numbers to a number of objects and enhances the understanding of quantities and measurements. As children begin to hone their skills in number sense, they are developing the ability to quickly estimate the number of items in sets. This process is called *subi*tizing, the ability to assess what is more or less.

### **MEASUREMENTS, GEOMETRY, PATTERNS, AND MUCH MORE**

An enriched math program at SDA exposes children to the math concepts that are more relatable to children. For

example, counting two dinosaurs and then adding one more. Sorting dinosaurs in groups based on size, both small and large, characteristics such as spikes and no spikes, or arranging them from shortest to tallest. Children begin to develop an understanding of numeracy when they learn what each number represents. Additionally, children are building skills of scientific inquiry through activities such as sorting, comparing, and identifying similarities and differences between objects.

One of the critical components of a quality preschool program is block play. By using blocks of various shapes and sizes, children learn about spatial literacy. Spatial literacy requires familiarity with shapes and spatial skills. Research shows that developed spatial literacy not only helps in later success in math and reading but leads to increased children's IQ. For developing spatial vocabulary, or the *Language of Space*, SDA emphasizes the use of words such as front, behind, over, under, in, and out.





These words help them follow directions once they begin formal schooling.

Identifying and creating patterns help children make predictions, inferences, and develop logic and reasoning skills. Understanding the concept of growing patterns in counting provides them a basis for multiplication. Popular preschool games such as walk-tiptoe-jump and crawl and repeat helps the development of kinetic intelligence.

By incorporating games and fun activities, students develop a love for mathematics and find it easy to solve even complex problems. I often teach math at our upper elementary level and sometimes in middle school grades. It is such a pleasure to have students say, "Dr. Majeed, you make learning math fun!" Students find mathematics fun and learn at a higher level because many of the students have attended Self Development Preschool and early grades, and have been purposefully exposed to early math literacy curriculum.

A Medical Power of Attorney is a critical step in your estate planning process. You may have an attorney draft a custom document for you that lists out specific decisions


related to your health and healthcare options. There are also many fill-in-the-blank Medical Power of Attorney forms available. The form will need to be witnessed or notarized to become effective.

Both our families have experienced war, so the horrors in Ukraine unsettle

us the most. We can't imagine what families are going through and the losses of life and property are beyond comprehension. It makes us so grateful to live in this country each day.

Our experience during the Great Recession was more recent and we all have a bit of dread at the thought of another recession coming our way. It was such a challenging time here, but because of that time, we are extra grateful to live in Arizona today. We are in such a different place today and far more recession-proof than we have ever been before.

Here are five reasons why you shouldn't worry (even though the news makes you feel like you should).

1. Arizona Has the Jobs. Arizona is in the middle of tremendous organic economic growth — the beneficiary of high costs, unfavorable tax policies, and restrictive regulations in other states. 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
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

### Red Mountain High School Team Competes in StellarXplorers National Final

magine spending a weekend at the Houston Space Center competing against nine other teams to solve orbit planning, satellite component, and launch vehicle selection scenarios in the finals of the Stellar Xplorers National Space Design Competition. Well, that's exactly what one team from Red Mountain High School accomplished recently.

The team, consisting of Garrett Comes (Captain), Hayden Farrell (Co-Captain), Keegan Rothlisberger, Samuel Smith, Zachary Parker, and Ashley Pantier, competed against 374 teams in a team building, problemsolving experience that started in October and ended in April. Students were challenged to solve various scenarios provided by the National Stellar Xplorers staff.

Working in partnership with leaders in the U.S. space industry, the StellarXplorers Aerospace STEM program inspires K-12 students toward careers in aerospace, aviation, and other science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) disciplines critical to our nation's future.

The competition is an exciting hands-on learning experience that develops commercially valuable skills and increases appreciation for the critical role of space in our daily lives. It attracts all types of students with diverse backgrounds building teamwork and leadership skills. The curriculum is a stimulating addition to STEM curriculum with real-world application.

The Red Mountain team advanced to the final competition. Team member Ashley summarized her participation and opportunity to compete at the highest level. "Stellar Xplorers has been such an amazing experience. I have been able to learn more about aerospace engineering and we use industry-grade programs to solve problems. This was an opportunity that opened my eyes to the world of aerospace and showed me how to develop a solution to a problem of significant value," Ashley said. "I learned the importance of teamwork and how to think out of the box when solving a mathematical problem."

When participating in the competition, each of the 375 teams were given one scenario during their six-hour competition period (eight-hour competition period for




finals). This included determining orbits, picking satellite components, and selecting launch vehicles that meet mission requirements throughout the rounds of competition. Each qualifying round was proceeded by a practice round that covered the corresponding tasking.

64 teams advanced to the semi-final round, and the best of the best - including the Red Mountain High School team - advanced to the in-person National Finals Competition.

"It was amazing to watch our students participate in this competition and to see the appreciation for math, science, and the aerospace industry grow," said Adam Middleton, Red Mountain High School team director. "The problems presented were challenging but approachable and pushed students to grow and develop through collaboration. Each round left the team waiting in suspense to know how they did. Each student on the team had a real sense of pride and accomplishment after each round, not just based on their score but based on what they achieved working through the task."

"I know that my students are better students and better future engineers as a result of their participation, and I am so proud of the success they have had."■



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# Learn How to Sign up for Medicare

ast month I talked about when to sign up for Medicare. As I mentioned, it all depends on your current coverage, your future plans, etc. This month I thought we would talk about how to sign up. This can be a bit complicated (after all it's the government) but I will try and just cover the basics.



If you are receiving Social Security benefits or disability benefits prior to your 65th birthday, you will automatically be enrolled in Medicare when you turn 65. If you don't want Medicare at this time, you will need to call Medicare and let them know. This is the only situation where you are automatically enrolled.

If you are not receiving Social Security benefits prior to your 65th birthday, you will need to apply for Medicare. You can do this one of four ways:

- Online at ssa.gov. This is the easiest and fastest way if you are comfortable with a computer. You'll need to create your secure My Social Security account to sign up for Medicare or apply for benefits.
- You can call Social Security at (800) 772-1213 and enroll over the phone. Generally, you will have about a 30-minute wait.
- Make an appointment and go to a local Social Security office. To make an appointment you can call (800) 772-1213. The website currently states you can go without an appointment but expect long lines.
- Mail or fax in an application.

If you want help with any of these options, I am more than willing to assist you. Unfortunately, this can be overwhelming to some people, so feel free to reach out for help.

# Six Things to Know About Mental Illness in Older Adults

he term *mental illness* can sound like an exaggeration, but depression, grief, and anxiety are a big deal. Sadness or worry can affect us at any time of life, but as we get older some of us face special challenges — and low moods can persist and become hard to recover from.

#### **SLEEP**

Sleep is often a key indicator of whether or not an aging adult is suffering from mental illness. Insomnia is a disorder that inhibits a person's ability to fall and remain asleep. This disorder is particularly common in seniors with a decline in mental and brain health.

#### **DIFFICULTY IN DIAGNOSIS**

Diagnosing mental illness in the elderly is much more challenging than it is for younger age groups. This is caused by the fact that the symptoms of poor mental health often overlap with those of the other illnesses the aging adult may be facing.

### PHYSICAL CONSEQUENCES OF POOR MENTAL HEALTH

The effects of mental illness in the elderly can threaten a person's physical health in three primary ways. First, depression increases the risk of cardiac issues.

Furthermore, not only does poor mental health put

the senior at risk for more physical ailments, but it also increases the likelihood of death when those physical illnesses strike. The third and final way depression can affect an aging adult physically is that it exacerbates existing illnesses.

### **TREATMENT**

There are numerous effective ways to help promote healthy aging by increasing long-term brain and mental health in older adults. Receiving counseling from a therapist is a good step to take if a loved one is willing and able to speak about their depression or mental health fluctuations.

As always, support from friends and family goes a long way to increase the overall well-being of aging adults.

Declining mental health is a struggle that many of us will face as we age, but with the proper care, support, and guidance, anyone can begin making great strides toward reclaiming contentment and happiness.

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
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
