The Christmas Idea House features



PARENTS ARE PARTNERS IN EDUCATION

It is hard to believe that schools are already in the midst of their third school year in a post-pandemic era. While schools across the nation adapt to address learning gaps because of online learning and high levels of absences during quarantine, teachers and administrators have also discovered an unexpected secondary result of pandemic learning.

Students returning post-pandemic have higher levels of disciplinary issues and low levels of fundamental student skills such as note-taking, task management, organization, and study skills.

What can be done to address these complex and widespread needs in both academics and behavior? The answer lies in a strong partnership between parents and schools. Though the problems faced by schools are new, research from as early as the '80s has documented that "parent involvement in children's learning is positively related to achievement... This holds true for all types of parent involvement in children's learning and for all types and ages of students." (Colton, 2-3).

The most crucial tool for parent involvement is active communication between teachers and parents. While it may have once been enough to ask students how they are doing in class and if they need any help, no longer is this type of inquiry adequate. The best source for that information

regarding student performance is the student's teacher.

Communication between parents and schools needs to be multifaceted. Very rarely should communication come from a single source. Proactive schools should reach out in hardcopy methods, like letters home and written progress reports; verbal conversations, both in formal meetings, such as parent-



teacher conferences and in more informal moments, like phone calls or chats before or after school; and digital communication such as emails, classroom workspaces such as Google classroom, and online grading systems.

Early communication and quick parent responses are pivotal to effective communication. Proactive parents should, at the very

least, check student grades once a week. They should also check the email account they registered with their student's school to be sure they have the most up-to-date information.

When it comes to behavior management, it helps schools when parents work together with teachers to reinforce behavior expectations and corrections. Schools desperately need parents' trust when reaching out about behavior issues. Similar to children of split households, student behavior can often vary between home and school, as it does from parent to parent.

Certain behaviors might never occur at home, but if the school is reaching out about it, it *has* become an issue for them. If parents and schools are on the same side of behavior issues, consequences and corrections become much smoother and more effective than when the school must reinforce alone. Parents should enforce these at home.

Parents can also be advocates for the school by modeling desired behaviors and sticking to and defending school disciplinary decisions. Frequently student behavior escalates when parents contradict the school when students are at home or, to an even more destructive effect, outrightly insult the school or teachers in the student's presence. If parents truly have concerns about school policy or other occurrences, they need to reach out to the school, not complain to their students. Not only does that further inflame

negative behavior at school, but it also means parent concerns won't ever be addressed if the school is not made aware.

It is also worth noting that students pick up on many subtle indicators about their parent's attitudes toward education in general




based on their parent's actions. Post-pandemic, schools have had an increase in student absences related to long vacations during the school year. While it is relatively harmless to miss a day or two at the beginning or end of a long weekend, extended absences of a week or more can negatively impact students in many ways.

The best way to help students is for parents to model the desired behaviors. Students will benefit from parents exemplifying good study habits and organization. For example, if parents and schools wish students to read more or improve their reading skills, parents should read with their children or be seen reading on their own time.

All in all, there are numerous ways parents can work together with schools to ensure their students' success academically and behaviorally, but they are all rooted in proper communication. Like all conversations, this communication must extend both ways, from parents to teachers and teachers to parents. Parents must also put in the work at home to bolster the school while teaching their students their way. Together as partners in education, parents and schools can strengthen their students and improve educational outcomes.

Gelato & Coffee in Northeast Mesa has a cool option serve gelato pies for dinner desserts, and parties.

"When thinking about the holiday season, it is common to serve pies like pumpkin and apple for dessert. So, I decided to create gelato pies for a different surprise treat," Brian revealed.

He has come up with at least a half dozen special flavors that include the pie crust mixed right into the gelato flavor — similar to a Cookies & Cream-style ice cream. Brian has created Spicy Pumpkin, Caramel Green Apple, Key Lime, Banana Cream, Passion Fruit Cheesecake, and Peach Cobbler — with perhaps more to come.

"Party holders can special order any size cup or waffle cone cup packed with one or two flavors, and have them delivered or picked up frozen. We are one of the few gelato shops that offer two flavors in our smallest size cup."

Brian also suggests ordering gelato cups and waffle cones or cups for that birthday party or shower to make it a more special event. In addition to the pie flavors, Brian offers 24 regularly available flavors such as White Chocolate Cherry, Bailey's Coffee Crunch, or Birthday Cake.

"We successfully did a dinner party of 40 which was

served in medium cups, and are currently working on a bridal shower. I would like people to know this can be made fresh, custom-ordered frozen and it will not melt on the drive home," Brian said.

"For the lactose intolerant, we have several flavors of sorbet without dairy, such as Dark Chocolate, and all our berry flavors such as Triple Berry. And diet-conscious

> gelato lovers will be happy to learn that gelato has about half the calories per serving of ice cream. It has less fat and more taste."

Party makers are welcome to come in and taste the flavors or give Brian a call to get more information.

But let's not forget about the coffee part of Gourmet Gelato & Coffee. Brian opens up early at 7 a.m. for those who want their morning brew. He offers House Blend and American style, and coffee favorites such as lattes, cappuccinos, and mochas with a variety of syrup flavors.

Almond and oat milk mixtures are also available.

Want a little gelato with your caffeine? Order an Affagato — your choice of gelato in a cup with a shot of hot espresso poured on top. There's also a unique treat called a Gelato Slider. It's a Hawaiian Sweet Bun filled with your favorite gelato topped with a white chocolate glaze, then heated. No, the gelato doesn't melt.

There's also a variety of muffins and puff pastries to go with your coffee choice.

Brian is proud to say that all his gelato is house-made and fresh. "I always loved gelato, and one day I decided that's what I wanted to do."

Brian attended classes at Carpigiani Frozen Dessert University, an international school training in the art of artisan gelato-making. He then studied for two years under a mentor.

How a Seller-Paid Rate Buydown is a WIN/WIN FOR BUYERS AND SELLERS

Tigher interest rates are one of the top reasons why the market has done a sudden slow down since May.

The current real estate market is a lot different than it was a year ago, when we had record low inventory, homes

selling in one day, and bidding wars. It was a seller's market and sellers had all the control.

Then the sudden jump in interest rates followed by continued rate increases made buyers either put their decision to buy on hold or, for some, were priced out of the market altogether.

Although technically we are still in a seller's market, it feels more like a buyers' market and buyers are now in the driver's seat. Buyers are asking for repairs, which was almost nonexistent in the seller's market, when everyone was buying as-is. Buyers can now get their offer accepted when it is contingent on the sale of their current home, but the biggest change and something we haven't seen in the last year or two is buyers are asking for sellers' concessions.

Many buyers are tempted to ask for purchase price reductions. While this feels like a win, it might be better to ask the seller for that money in a concession. Seller's concessions can be used to pay for closing costs and to buy down the buyer's rate.

Sellers are seeing their homes sit on the market and will do price reductions to try and get their home sold. Offering sellers concessions that the buyer can use to buy down their rate — will not only entice buyers but will net the seller more money as well.



WHAT IS A SELLER-PAID RATE BUYDOWN

A rate buydown is a way for a buyer to obtain a lower interest rate by paying discount points at closing. Discount points are a one-time fee paid upfront that will reduce the interest rate for the loan term.

HERE IS AN EXAMPLE OF HOW DISCOUNT

Let's say you are looking to purchase a single-family home for \$700,000 and are putting 20 percent down. This would give you a loan amount of \$560,000. The interest rate is 7 percent on a 30-year fixed-rate mortgage.

If you want or need a lower interest rate to lower your monthly payment, you have to buy down the rate, which means paying a lump sum up-front (discount point), that will reduce your rate. To buy down the rate by 0.5 percent, it will cost you one percent of the loan amount — so in this scenario, one percent is \$5,600, that would be added to your closing costs, and your interest rate would drop from 7.0 to 6.5 percent and save you \$186.11 per month.

A PRICE REDUCTION VERSUS A BUYDOWN

If you were going to offer \$10,000 below the seller's list price, in the example above, that would only lower the payment by \$63.21. If you were to put that same \$10,000 to work in points and buy down the rate, it would lower the monthly payment by \$271.57. From a monthly payment perspective, asking for the concession and paying full price makes more sense than getting a \$10,000 lower purchase price and paying the full interest rate.



Doing something kind for others, either a favor or a thoughtful gift, gets our focus off of our own emotional state. Doing this turns our focus towards others' happiness, which has a boomerang effect on our own.

GRATITUDE

No matter what we struggle with, building our gratitude for things we have can sustain us. I recommend building lists of things for which we are grateful, and then reviewing the list as often as we can. The next time we feel pain and heartache,

that list can be pulled out to review. But it's more than just having the list; it's also about a concerted effort to emotionally build that emotional gratitude within ourselves, which will increase joy.

COMBINE THEM

A fun act of service we can do for family members is to build a list of reasons for which we are grateful for them, and then giving it to them as a Christmas gift. This is one of the most powerful things we can do to enrich our relationships and make our holiday experiences more joyful by focusing on others. And that is ultimately what these holidays are about.
