Technology and Academic Honesty at Self Development Academy

or all the benefits and pitfalls of living in the information age, the temptation and accessibility to plagiarize reigns at the top. With a world of knowledge at their fingertips, students can research topics like past generations could not. They can watch experts on videos, listen to interviews on podcasts, and read article upon article.

They can also claim ideas as their own, copy and paste words, and even find websites based on specific curriculum that post answers to entire assignments and tests.

Using technology wisely includes academic honesty that does not partake in cheating, plagiarism, or stealing ideas. As students grow and build upon their habits, now is the most important time to address integrity.

Beyond monitoring your students' computer time and class assignments, look out for these indicators that technology and academic honesty might be a real struggle.

PROCRASTINATION

Students who regularly put off work find themselves in a bind. With incomplete assignments or failing to study for a test, it is tempting to find a quick solution just a click away. In a world of instant gratification, putting in the work





to earn a grade seems laborious. Remember, a shoddy attempt to reword information still counts as plagiarism.

Coming up with original ideas, writing drafts and proofreading, and internalizing information takes time. Nothing of deep and lasting value comes quickly.

PERFECTION

Students who want to perform may decide that their best effort would go a lot further if they adopted someone else's words. Without making the ideas and argument their own, adopting other words really amounts to stealing. Many times, students do not realize that plagiarism is stealing when they're solely focused on performing well in class.

PEOPLE PLEASING

It is still academic dishonesty if your student is the one supplying the answers. When students want so badly to be accepted or make friends, providing other students with answers or completed assignments can seem like a helpful solution. Of course, it is not helpful in the long run, and it is cheating.

If you find yourself in a great learning opportunity with your student — to focus on technology and academic honesty — take these following steps to hone in.

HELP PLAN

Buy a student planner. Set alarms for study time and play time. Review homework. The only cure for procrastination is action, but that needs to ultimately fall on your student's shoulders. Investigate what internal motivations will not only help your student to complete assignments but to also learn the material and take ownership over the process.

ALLOW NATURAL CONSEQUENCES


If your child doesn't complete an assignment or study for a test, a poor grade is the appropriate consequence. Let her know you would prefer that over a dishonest A. PRIZE CHARACTER

It can be easy for students and parents to get wrapped up in GPA numbers. But a grade your student earned on a test won't matter in 20 years; the habits they formed in the process will. PICKLE IN THE TREE — GERMANY



The Christmas tree tradition embraced around the world today is believed to have started in Germany back in the 16th century. One Christmas tradition in Germany is to hide a pickle somewhere within the

branches of the tree, and give a gift to whichever child in the household finds it.

Some claim that the tradition may not be German after all. One legend says that the Christmas pickle originated in Spain when two young boys were held as prisoners inside a pickle barrel. The heroic Saint Nicholas rescued the boys and brought them back to life.

ROLLER SKATE MASS — VENEZUELA

In the Venezuelan capital of Caracas, swathes of citydwellers make their way to mass on roller skates every year on Christmas morning. The tradition is now so well established that many of the city's streets are closed to traffic from 8 a.m. so that the skating congregation can get to church safely. It's even said that children will sleep with one lace from their skates tied around their toe, the other skate dangling from the window so that their friends can wake them up with a friendly tug on the lace.

BEFANA THE WITCH — ITALY

When you think of Christmas food, mince pies and turkey are often high on the list. In South Africa, however, it's the creepy crawlies that local children

look forward to. Festive fried caterpillars may seem like one of the more unusual Christmas traditions, but these caterpillars aren't just the run-of-the-mill variety you find in the garden. The Pine Tree Emperor Moth, or Christmas caterpillar, is covered in very festive hues — giving all who swallow a little extra luck in the coming year.

THE ALTERNATIVE CHRISTMAS TREE -**NEW ZEALAND**



Thought all Christmas trees were created equal? Think again. The Kiwis are all about the Pohutukawa, a beautiful tree that is native to New Zealand with gnarled

roots and bright crimson flowers. The first mention of the Pohutukawa tree came from Austrian geologist Ferdinand

von Hochstetter in 1867. He described locals decorating their churches and homes with the brightly-colored branches at Christmas.

Today, the Pohutukawa tree is a recognized symbol of Christmas around New Zealand and is featured on Christmas cards, decorations, and even in the Christmas carols that children sing at school.

THE YULE GOAT — SWEDEN



The Christmas tradition from Sweden may be the oldest still celebrated out of them all. The Yule Goat dates back to at least the 11th century, where there are mentions of a man-sized goat figure, led by Saint Nicholas, who had the power to control the devil.

The Yule Goat has changed quite a bit throughout history. In

the 17th century, it was popular for young men to dress as the goat creature and run around pulling pranks and demanding gifts. By the 19th century, the goat became the good guy — a giver of gifts. Instead of Father Christmas, men in the family would dress up as the goat and give gifts to the entire family.

Today, the man goat is no longer and the Yule Goat has taken its place in modern history as a traditional Christmas ornament on trees throughout Sweden. In the larger cities, giant versions of these goat ornaments are created out of straw and red ribbons. ■



Why Choose Hormone Pellets Therapy?

GET RID OF THE GRUMPYS AND GET YOUR HAPPY BACK

By Laura Markison, NMD, Mesa Naturopathic ymptoms of testosterone deficiency for both men and women are weight gain and insulin resistance, memory loss and brain fog, loss of muscle tone,

body aches, sexual dysfunction including low libido, lack of

mental motivation, and even depression.

Symptoms of estrogen deficiency in women are depression, anxiety, weight gain, hot flashes, night sweats, vaginal dryness, and pain. Generally, hormone deficiency makes men and women feel grumpy all the time.

At Mesa Naturopathic, hormone deficiencies are checked along with general health markers at your first appointment with a blood test — we offer cash pricing and take insurance for the lab tests. Then a discussion will happen on the different types of hormone replacement. For my female patients, I usually start them off on hormone cream so they can get used to the increase in hormones. Males can start immediately with pellets if they want. Choices for men are injectable, gel, or pellet testosterone.

So why choose pellets? They are the most consistent way to keep hormone levels balanced. Hormone creams can take a month or more to get optimal hormone levels due to having to be absorbed through the skin. Absorption issues include too much sweating, not applying it correctly, or skin absorption not being optimal.

Injectables for men can give them a feeling of being on a roller coaster during the week with high levels of testosterone surging at the beginning days of the injection and then sudden drops in levels at the end of seven days. To combat this, I usually have my men do two half-dose injections a week.

This brings in the issue of some men not wanting to do injections at all. Gel testosterone can be transferred to loved ones and must be applied every day. Our busy lives can distract us from using our hormones as directed and thus not getting the full benefit from these types of hormone therapies.

This is where pellets win every time. Pellets are small, rice-shaped, and inserted into the gluteal/hip area every three to four months. The pellets are inserted in the superficial fat just below the skin. The skin is numbed, a small incision is made, and then the pellets are inserted with a unique Pellecome device that was invented to place the pellets perfectly flat and even. The small incision is taped, and the wound is usually healed within three to five days.

Personally, I have received hormone pellet therapy myself for over 10 years. I became weary of putting creams on every day. The convenience of pellets is once they are in, you can go about your life without thinking about applying or injecting anything. Hormone levels improve in two weeks and are optimal within six weeks. Then the levels stay steady for about three more months. Once the levels start to come down, more are inserted so there isn't this bottoming-out surge of symptoms. Blood levels are checked before each additional insertion appointment.

Contraindications for estrogen hormone therapy for women include a history of breast or uterine cancer or clotting issues. Contraindications for testosterone replacement therapy are high-risk cardiovascular issues, history of clotting disorders, and prostate cancer. (Though testosterone is cardioprotective, it helps prevent type 2 diabetes, and protects men from aggressive prostate cancer.)

Also, testosterone can build blood, creating excess red blood cells, hemoglobin, and hematocrit, mostly in men. These levels must be checked every three to four months to prevent thick blood, which can lead to complications. In the event there is an increase in these blood cells, a pint of blood will be donated. This is healthy to do anyway donating a pint of blood activates bone marrow and new, healthy red blood cells are made.







What to know about sustainable investing

Tou may have heard about sustainable investing. But if you're not familiar with it, you may have some questions: What does it involve? Is it right for me? Can I follow a sustainable investing strategy and still get the portfolio performance I need to reach my goals?



Sustainable investing can be defined in different

ways, with different terminologies. However, one way to look at a sustainable approach is by thinking of it as investing in a socially conscious way which may involve two broad categories: environmental, social and governance (ESG) investing and values-based investing.

As its name suggests, ESG investing incorporates a broad range of environmental, social and governance risks and opportunities, along with traditional financial measures, when making investment decisions. This approach may have a neutral impact on performance because it maintains a focus on managing risk, traditional fundamental analysis, and diversification. Here's a quick look at the ESG elements:

- Environmental Companies may work to reduce carbon emissions, invest in renewable energy, decrease pollution, and conserve water resources.
- Social A business may promote gender and pay equality within its workforce and maintain positive labor relations and safe working conditions for employees.

Governance - Companies distinguished by good governance may institute strong ethics policies, provide transparent financial reporting, and set policies to ensure it has an independent, objective board of directors.

You can pursue an ESG investing approach through individual stocks, mutual funds, or exchange-traded funds (ETFs), which hold a variety of investments similar to mutual funds, but are generally passively managed – that is, they do little or no trading.

Now, let>s move on to values-based investing. When you follow a values-based approach, you can focus on specific themes where you may choose to include or exclude certain types of investments that align with your personal values.

So, you could refrain from investing in segments of the market, such as tobacco or firearms, or in companies that engage in certain business practices, such as animal testing. On the other hand, you could actively seek out investments that align with your values.

One potential limitation of valuesbased investing is that it may decrease the diversification of your portfolio and lead to materially lower returns due to narrowly focused investments, prioritization of non-financial goals and too many exclusions.

Ultimately, if you choose to include a sustainable investing approach, you will want – as you do in any investing scenario - to choose those investments that are suitable for your goals, risk tolerance and time horizon.


