

Naturopathic Medical Center Opens Second Location in Mesa

ast month, Naturopathic Medical Center, previously known as West **■** Valley Naturopathic Center, opened its second location in Northeast Mesa, offering overall health support to adults and children including treatment for autoimmune diseases, emotional concerns such as depression, and more.

"We want people to feel great not just okay, not just good, but great," said founder and medical director Dr. Brian Archambault, N.M.D. "When patients start to have energy, they are motivated and can start to have an impact within their households. The whole household benefits from that, allowing us to make a generational change."

The success at the Goodyear location led to the expansion to Northeast Mesa, allowing more people to benefit and feel their best.

Dr. Jordan Trapp, who has a background working with chronic disease, chronic infection, and integrated cancer care will be the physician at the Mesa location. She came on board at Naturopathic Medical Center to provide more general care to patients and help more people.

Many of her patients are seeing results with hormone replacement therapy, IV therapy, and ozone therapy,

which are all offered within the practice.

New patients meet with a physician for a one-hour consultation to dive deep into the patient's current symptoms and medical care before deciding on the next steps.

"It parallels what you would typically see with your primary care allopathic physician, but you're getting more time and more attention with our doctors," said

Within three to six months, the team usually finds patients feeling great. At this

point, the patient will continue to have a six-month test phase to ensure they continue to feel better, and their treatment is working effectively.

"What we're working toward is not being a third, fourth, or fifth option for people who are not feeling well," said Dr. Archambault. "From my perspective, the way we do medicine is the way that medicine was and the way it should be. Most of our allopathic counterparts are seeing up to 40 people a day, and they're frustrated because they realize the model is ineffective and inefficient. Our goal is to give people amazing health care."

While many insurance providers do not contract with naturopathic offices, some insurance plans will reimburse patients for the cost of treatment. Patients are also

able to use their health savings account for any treatment through the Naturopathic Medical Center.

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The Rigor of Early Childhood and K-8 Grade EDUCATION MAKE ALL THE DIFFERENCE

f you happen to be at Self Development Preschool between 4:30 and 5 p.m., the time when parents are picking up their students, you will hear the repeated requests which include, "May I stay a little longer" and "I am not ready to go yet."

Parents are comforted by the fact that not only are their children in a safe and nurturing environment but they are actually having fun.

Self Development Preschool (SDP) has been serving the Mesa community since 1988 and the award-winning K-8 Self Development Academy (SDA) was established in 2000. An online school was added in 2021.

Each year the leadership team meets to reassess the successes and experiences of SDA and its community and then incorporates innovative ideas to provide the most rigorous curriculum in a nurturing environment for our students.

This fall, besides focusing on a rigorous accelerated curriculum, the school plans to add an in-depth music program and enrich the experiences of students through art appreciation along with emphasizing logic and reasoning. Additionally, the school culture of respect and responsibility lends itself to incorporating the Four Rs of the SDA community.

RIGOR OF THE CURRICULUM

SDP is committed to an ideal early education by integrating arts, science, music, and math using a thematic curriculum. This coming fall, the four-year-olds at the preschool will be taking kindergarten coursework under the guidance of degreed teachers. We know they will be excitedly learning the readiness skills for school success and some will be reading with fluency and expressions.



With the emphasis on early literacy, our K-2 program is accelerated and provides enriched experiences at one to two grade levels higher. The pattern will continue as students move to the upper grades. Some of our fifth-grade students will be enrolled in middle school as fifth graders and will have their own classroom taking middle school classes.

Our students in 6th, 7th, and 8th

grade will have the opportunity to take high-school-level courses with high-school-certified teachers in their subject areas. They can enroll in subjects such as geometry, algebra II, and pre-calculus as middle school students. They will also participate in a service project.

FOUR RS OF SDA CULTURE

The Four Rs embedded in the culture of SDA include the following: being respectful, being responsible, being ready, and being resilient. The Four Rs at SDA embody the practice of standards and principles to live a life as a good citizen.

The characteristics of the culture at SDA include being kind to each other and treating each other with respect. Becoming responsible helps students think about their interactions with their peers and members of the school community. Students become aware of their actions and how they lead to their success, experiences, and how to connect the consequences with their actions. They grow and mature and move toward becoming good citizens.

Being ready or be prepared is a universal message given to youngsters. Being prepared supports the state of readiness of mind and body. Learning to be resilient cultivates in students to accept disappointments and, yet, keep an optimistic attitude about one's future. Through resilience, students learn to work hard and gain confidence.

Though many schools are selecting to do away with their music programs, SDA's goal is to enhance the music program to bring enrichment to students' education. Besides learning to play an instrument and enjoy music, there are numerous benefits to a good music program in schools.

Music enhances language and reasoning abilities along with memorization skills and increases eye-hand coordination. Using memory to perform when using sheet music helps students in memorizing and developing fluency for example, the memorization of math facts.

> SDA's music program begins at the preschool level with listening to the works of many classical composers and singing and dancing to familiar children's songs to a more in-depth knowledge about the composers and their styles, and learning to play the recorder, violin, and percussion instruments. SDA will also have an honors band/ orchestra which will meet three times a week for those students who are committed to learning and mastering

the instrument they desire to play.

SDA has consistently been among the top-ranked schools in the state and nationally. Last year, SDA was ranked No. 2 based on percentage points earned in state tests (ADE, 2022) and ranked nationally as the No. 4 Best Public Charter School and No. 7 Best Public Elementary (Niche, 2023). ■

his fall, the City of Mesa and JustServe.org will join in commemorating the 9/11 National Day of Service by encouraging families, faith groups, neighbors, and employers to grab a friend, find a good cause, and volunteer on or around Sept. 11.

These acts of service serve a dual purpose — they stand as a tribute to those lost or injured on Sept. 11, 2001, and they promote the same spirit of unity the country experienced after the terrorist attacks 22 years ago. The 911Day.org website hopefully declares that "coming together in a spirit of kindness, no matter our differences,

has the power to change lives, and ultimately, our world."

The national movement to honor Sept. 11 by participating in community service started with a nonprofit organization called 9/11 Day. The two founders, one of whom lost a brother in the terrorist attacks, "began with a simple idea — let's take back the day by turning the anniversary of 9/11 into a day of doing good." (911day.org/about-911-day/) From those simple beginnings, 9/11 Day has grown, and it is now a federally recognized day of service in

which tens of millions of Americans volunteer in their communities.

Last year for 9/11 Day in Arizona, one Mesa congregation worked with the nonprofit, *A New Leaf*, to organize thousands of unsorted clothing donations, collected hundreds more, cleaned up and renovated the landscaping at one of their shelters, and refurbished outdoor furniture. One of the organizers of that project, Bruce Kiene, reported that although it was a big effort for their congregation — and not without challenges — they "were very blessed, accomplished amazing things, and all parties involved felt rewarded by the service. We also met

many new friends in the community." Bruce is already working on organizing this year's project, which will include *A New Leaf* and a few new projects.

Local businesses, faith groups, families, and neighborhood groups around Mesa are already making plans to participate in the City of Mesa's officially designated day of service — Sept. 16. But the 9/11 Day effort will extend far beyond Mesa. Cities and towns across the Valley, state, and country will participate in the *Day of Service* with a variety of projects.

In Payson, one group plans to work cleaning up trails in the national forest. In Fort Worth, Texas, another group

will collect hygiene kits. The 9/11
Day organization itself sponsors
large meal pack events in 18 cities
around the country, from Boston
to Los Angeles, and Minneapolis to
Houston — including one in Tempe.

Local families, faith-based organizations, businesses, and community groups who would like to participate in 9/11 Day can find hundreds of ideas at JustServe.org, which is a full partner of the 9/11 Day organization. Free to use for both nonprofit organizations or potential volunteers, JustServe.org lists projects suited to many ages, budgets, skill sets, and group sizes.

The JustServe.org platform makes it very easy for those who want to participate in the 9/11 Day of Service and Remembrance to find a project in their community that suits their time and skills while serving side-by-side with their neighbors to meet needs in their communities. ast month, Dr. Zaina Rashid of La Peau Dermatology talked about some ✓of the benefits of Sylfirm X treatments for aging skin. She outlined the ways radiofrequency and micro needling stimulate cellular responses for tighter skin and a boost in collagen and elastin.

"You may need to avoid some skincare products with potent active ingredients like retinoids, vitamin C serums, and exfoliating acids for a few days following treatment," said Dr. Rashid.

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Is a Home Warranty Worth It?

7hether it's worth getting a home warranty depends on your individual circumstances and preferences. It's also one of those topics where people either love them or hate them.



Some people love having a home warranty, have had great experiences with them and renew it every year while others think they are a total waste of money or have had a bad experience with them.

The reason I am writing this article is because I received an email from a long-time client, Phil, who just purchased another home. He had an issue with the AC unit, called the home warranty company I recommended — which is also a brand-new home warranty company and it was fixed and up and running again within 24 hours.

HOME WARRANTY — WHEN BUYING A HOME

The one time I always recommend getting a home warranty is on the purchase of a home (with the exception of a new build). You are buying a used home and don't know anything about the condition of appliances and systems other than what you found out during the home inspection and on the seller's disclosure.

You have just put a lot of cash into this purchase so the last thing you need is an unexpected expensive repair.

The best part of getting a home warranty when you are buying a home is you can ask the seller to pay for it. You still get to pick the home warranty company of your choosing and unless you are in a bidding war, the seller usually agrees to pay for it as part of the contract and you get a free home warranty for the first year.

HOME WARRANTY — ON YOUR EXISTING HOME

A home warranty is a protection for if and when things break down. You may be paying for years and not have any issues or may be using it several times on big-ticket items

and get your investment back in the first few months.

It's also peace of mind that if you do have a costly repair you won't have to pay out of pocket. You don't have to search for a local repair contractor, you just contact the warranty company, and they will take care of it for you.

Here are some factors to consider when deciding on whether to purchase an annual home warranty on your

- Age and Condition of Your Home: If you have an older home or older appliances and systems that are more prone to breakdowns, a home warranty might provide added peace of mind.
- Budget and Finances: Home warranties come with annual premiums and a service fee for each claim. Consider whether you have the financial means to cover unexpected repairs without a warranty and if the cost of the warranty fits within your budget.
- Risk Tolerance: Some homeowners prefer the certainty of knowing that they have coverage for potential repairs, while others might be comfortable taking their chances and dealing with repairs as they come.
- Homeowner's Skill Level: If you're handy and capable of doing minor repairs yourself, you might not need a home warranty as much as someone who prefers to hire professionals for all repairs.

WHAT TO CONSIDER WHEN CHOOSING A **HOME WARRANTY COMPANY**

Home warranties can vary in terms of coverage so it's essential to review the contract carefully to understand what is included and excluded. Be aware of any limitations and exclusions, or caps on repair costs and replacements.

There are several plan levels and add-ons and each home warranty company is different. While one may include the kitchen refrigerator in their basic plan another doesn't and it's an add-on. I have had clients who think their refrigerator was included only to find out it wasn't

when they needed to have it repaired.

One of the biggest expenses, if not the biggest living in Arizona, is the HVAC system. This alone can make a home warranty worth the annual premium, to know if your AC breaks down in the middle of the summer the repair will be covered. If the unit

cannot be repaired and you have the right plan, the home warranty will replace the unit for you. Ensure whichever plan you get has good coverage for your AC repairs and replacement and check what the maximum limit is. Some plans will include the refrigerant while others don't and that can add up if you need to add more.

If you have high-end appliances there will be an extra fee for like-for-like replacement, so make sure you compare companies and plans as well as the maximum limits.

Consider the service provider's reputation as well. Research the reputation and customer reviews of the home warranty company you are considering, ensuring they provide timely and reliable service.

If you are considering a home warranty company, ask your friends and family how they like the company they use. Also, one of your best resources is a Realtor. Realtors refer their clients to home warranty companies and get to know which ones offer the best plans and service plus we get great feedback from our clients, both good and bad. We also know the local reps and can help if our clients have an issue that they are unable to resolve with the warranty company directly.







SMART WAYS TO Invest in Bonds

type of bond ladder, you can take advantage of changing interest-rate environments. When interest rates are rising, you can reinvest your maturing, shorter-term bonds at the new rates. And when market rates are low, you'll still have your longer-term bonds working for you, as these longterm bonds generally pay higher rates.

If they're appropriate for your situation, bond funds and bond ladders can help diversify your portfolio. And while diversification — in either stocks or bonds — can't always guarantee success or avoid losses, it remains a core principle of successful investing. ■

While Barro's is a great job for now, Eyan has much bigger plans for the future with his ASU Prep Digital diploma now under his belt.


"My long-term plans are obviously to have a stable job. I want a family one day, but not for a while, a long while." he chuckled.





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

his is what a hot-air balloon looks like from inside the basket. I had the privilege of experiencing this a few years ago. The ride was delightful and full of surprises.

The biggest surprise was finding that my hair wasn't blowing in the wind. In fact, I couldn't even feel or hear the wind. Yet, I knew it had to be blowing because I could tell that the balloon kept traveling sideways. We were part of the wind, and whichever way it went, we went. It didn't feel as if we were moving. We seemed to be suspended in absolute stillness, while the ground below moved slowly past.

Another surprise was the amazing quietness around us as we sailed above the Earth. The only sounds were our voices and the occasional loud *whoosh* of hot air being blasted upward to keep us aloft. As we sailed above the landscape, activities going on below seemed remote and disconnected from us.

How similar a balloon ride is to our spiritual lives. In God, "we live, and move, and have our being." (Acts 17:28) When we allow ourselves to dwell in God's presence, then wherever He goes, we go.

Whether or not we feel anything, we are in the flow of His Spirit, just as in the balloon we were one with the wind.

There is a hymn called *The Heavenly Vision* whose chorus begins with the line, "Turn your eyes upon Jesus." It says that when we do that, "the things of Earth will grow strangely dim." When I hear this song, it reminds me of the feeling I had while floating above the Earth in the balloon. The Apostle Paul admonished us to "set our affections on things above, not on things on the Earth" (Colossians 3:2), because our lives are "hidden with Christ in God."

By focusing on the pilot and the balloon, I felt secure in the basket. In the same way, we can focus on God's love and be secure in His presence. Then, like the activities on the ground, our circumstances will fade. They won't disappear, but when we're transported to a place where we can see them from God's perspective, they become less important.

Who knew a ride in a balloon would really be a picture of life with God?■

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Defining the Future at Mesa Public Schools

🔭 n 2018, the Mesa Public Schools community approved a \$300 million bond for capital projects that provided much-needed improvements to schools across the district. The community has generously kept an override in place since 1995, to support salaries and employee-related expenses.

Mesa Public Schools is aligning district facilities to support the needs of students. Projects completed include reinforced school safety and security systems, in-classroom technology, and renovations at Mountain View High School and Mesa High School, featuring new athletic fields, a performing arts center, and sci-tech and student services buildings.

Allen Moore, school safety and security director, shares that the district used bond money to establish very secure schools. Mesa created strong perimeter fencing, designed secure lobbies with one point of entry and video surveillance, and installed riot film on all glass windows that have students behind them.

In addition, Mesa added blue strobe lights to signal danger in conjunction with a mobile app that allows any staff member who sees a threat to put their facility into lockdown. Currently, 37 schools have been fully renovated to the district's current standards in school safety, and 2,400 video cameras have been installed throughout the district.

"Without the bond dollars, we couldn't do any of this important work, keeping our students safe," Allen said.

Scott Thompson, an assistant superintendent, shares the bond money supports student learning and helps students understand their career pathways. A great example is the new sci-tech building at Mesa High School.

"I visited the new welding area at Mesa High, and students were incredibly excited. They just finished working on a two-day project that would have taken them two weeks in their old facility," Scott shared. "The bond money provided the ability to create a proper environment where students can learn and create."

Mesa Public Schools is asking the community for a continuation of the bond and override to carry on the work being done. During the Nov. 7 special election, voters will have the opportunity to authorize the sale of up to \$500 million in bonds for capital improvements and a 15 percent budget override continuation.

Mesa Public Schools is the largest school district in Arizona, and there is more work to be done. Along with continued school safety renovations, the district would like to continue upgrading HVAC systems to newer, more efficient units, replace portable classrooms with permanent buildings, and continue to remodel and update aging schools. The override is used for staffing, funding 13.9 percent of employees' paychecks, as well as supporting workforce and college development, and lower class sizes.

"The override is a tax that is already in place," Scott shares. "We are asking the community to keep the tax in place so that we can continue to be competitive attracting qualified teachers and staff." ■

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

Free Weights vs. Machines: Which One Is Better?

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
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
