



Mesa Citizen of the Year Association Honors Students FOR EXCEPTIONAL SERVICE AND LIFELONG IMPACT

our outstanding seniors from Mesa Public Schools ◀ have received Student Community Service Awards from the Mesa Citizen of the Year Association. Regina Herrera Marquez and Jermalie Jean-Louis of Mountain View High School, along with Sadie Christie and Alexis Grondin of Red Mountain High School, were each awarded a \$2,500 scholarship in recognition of their exceptional dedication to community service.

To qualify, students must complete a minimum of 150 service hours during high school and demonstrate a strong commitment to ongoing community involvement. The Mesa Citizen of the Year Association underscores the significance of honoring the impactful volunteer efforts of Mesa Public Schools students, who actively contribute to city programs, nonprofits, and other vital community initiatives.

Founded in 1935 by Charles and Florence Mitten, the Mesa Citizen of the Year Award honors those who make a lasting difference in the community.

Regina plans to attend Arizona State University and major in political science. She hopes to pursue a career in public policy or government to help drive meaningful social and economic change.

She credits community service as a defining part of her personal growth, shaping her values and broadening her perspective on the world.

"As I've taken part in community service projects, I've learned the importance of keeping an open mind and understanding that people experience life in very different ways," she said. "It has also given me opportunities to connect with people I might never have met otherwise — like a single parent committed to their child's growth by attending daily swimming lessons or an elderly woman who starts each morning among the trees she planted in the park, appreciating the fresh air they provide."

Jermalie will attend the Wharton School of Business at the University of Pennsylvania, where she plans to study finance and pursue a career as a quantitative analyst.

She credits her passion for helping others to her mother, who fled Haiti to build a better future for her children. With the support of others, her mother became a homeowner and now gives back to her community, opening her home to help others succeed.

"I want to use my education and service experience in underprivileged communities to contribute to Penn's Projects for Progress, supporting poverty-stricken areas that lack educational opportunities," she said.

Sadie will attend Arizona State University, where she plans to major in political science with minors in Spanish and violin performance. She hopes to attend law school to become a prosecutor and, eventually, a judge.

"Through service, I've built meaningful connections with people beyond my immediate circle," she said.

Curiosity, Geometry, and Arts AND THE SHAPING OF THE FUTURE

n awe-inspiring education bewilders us with the amazement of the world, its workings, and its vast **k** knowledge. Developing a lifelong love for knowledge begins early with students experiencing joy, finding meaning in their school activities, and being engaged in learning. ACADEMIC RIGOR

Academic rigor for SDA is not about taking tests or doing hours of homework; it is more about providing opportunities to connect and explore real-world ideas, challenging beliefs, and using critical thinking for problem-solving. Our commitment to an accelerated curriculum will continue, and eligible students will have the opportunity to participate in courses at one to three grade levels higher than those of the Arizona State Standards. For example, SDA's eligible students can take Algebra II in eighth grade.





RESEARCH SKILLS

Research is the foundation of knowledge. SDA believes in teaching research skills to students as early as possible, developing lifelong skills of posing questions and finding solutions. The research process is a systematic approach to selecting a topic, posing a question, developing a methodology to collect information, analyzing and evaluating the findings, drawing a conclusion, and answering the original question. Students also learn to evaluate the credibility of sources, thus reinforcing the development of critical thinking. Learning research skills is not an easy task. However, like any skill, it must be practiced for proficiency.

They learn the life skills of notetaking. They can proudly share their research findings with an audience of classmates, parents, and the community. Developing research skills at an early age prepares them to become future scientists and experts to solve real-world problems and contribute to innovation and progress in unimaginable areas. Research skills are among the most valuable and reinforce a love of knowledge.

GEOMETRY AND ARTS

Ever wonder how geometry influences the arts? From the hexagonal cells of a honeycomb to the crystalline structure of minerals, geometry is all around us, shaping the world we live in. Modern physics relies on geometric concepts to describe the curvature of space-time and the fundamental forces that govern the universe. Even the human body exhibits remarkable geometric proportions, from the Golden Ratio in facial features to the symmetry of our limbs. Finally, our perception of beauty is often linked to geometric principles, such as symmetry, balance, and proportion.

Geometry is all around us. At SDA, we invite students on a journey through the interwoven beauty of art and mathematics. This is an interdisciplinary program that integrates history, art, mathematics, and science. Students will learn about the history of geometry as a field of study, a tool for survival, and a tool for delight from prehistoric man up to the present. They will use geometry in creating 2D and 3D perspectives and proportions, and appreciate the uncanny emergence of geometry that echoes in nature, including the Fibonacci sequence.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Through community service, students develop leadership skills, humility, and empathy. Working for the betterment of the underserved not only makes a significant difference but also has long-term and enduring benefits for students. Helping others allows students to meet new friends, develop new interests and skills, and gain a broader perspective. Their commitment to community service makes them stand out as candidates for competitive colleges and scholarships.

Volunteering brings joy and happiness, which is a reward in itself. SDA's design for vibrant learning lays the foundation for a lifelong love of knowledge.



oes your walk with God sometimes feel like a long, uphill bicycle ride? Many years ago, my husband described our life that way. It seemed that no matter how hard we tried to do all the right things, we were always struggling with some problem or other, never walking in true victory.

Whenever a big problem would hit us, our conversations would focus on what we might have done wrong. We were sure we should have done more, given more, or changed some behavior. We figured every problem was due to our failure to live up to God's expectations.

After years of this, we finally heard some good teaching on God's grace. First, we learned that we can't ever do enough to earn God's approval, or salvation, or any of His gifts. But the beautiful thing is that we don't have to. A gift doesn't have to be earned. God's blessings in our life are free gifts, based not on our performance, but on His goodness.

We'd been thinking God was like a heavenly vending machine. If we put in enough right behavior, then blessings and answers to prayer would pop out. But that's not how it works. Ephesians 2:8

says, "By grace are we saved through faith." We receive salvation by grace, not through our own actions, but through faith. Faith means believing what God says, no matter how things look.

But salvation is not the only gift God has for us. "He that spared not His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how shall He not with Him also freely give us all things?" (Romans 8:32). We access all His blessings just like we receive salvation, by grace through faith. We are also able to walk through our lives the same way. "So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, {by grace through faith}so walk in Him" (Colossians 2:6).

As we focus on what Jesus has already done for us, we'll stop trying to win God's favor by doing things to earn it. We won't stop doing good things, but we'll be doing them from a different mindset, a mindset of gratitude. We'll get off that long, uphill bicycle ride and walk instead into the abundant life Jesus has promised us. ■







Seller Concessions Benefit Both Buyers and Sellers

Tith most of the Phoenix metro area now in a buyer's market, buyers not only have more homes to choose from they also have more negotiation power than they've had in recent years. That shift means they're

A rate buydown allows buyers to use the seller's concession money to reduce their mortgage interest rate by paying discount points upfront at closing.

By investing a little more upfront, you can lock in a lower interest rate and enjoy smaller monthly payments for the life of your loan. This can make your home more affordable month-to-month and save you thousands of dollars in interest over time.

HERE'S HOW IT WORKS DISCOUNT POINTS

Each point typically costs 1% of the loan amount and lowers the interest rate by about 0.25%, depending on the

UPFRONT FEE

The fee is paid at closing — either by the buyer or through

LOWER MONTHLY PAYMENT

That reduced interest rate results in lower monthly mortgage payments.

LONG-TERM SAVINGS

Over the life of the loan, this can add up to significant savings in interest.

Southwest Autism Research and Resource Center establishes in Mesa

Tesa children with autism now have a new opportunity to be immersed in language rich classrooms with typical learners at a new preschool campus at Power and McKellips roads in Mesa. Both sets of students are gaining critical language skills at

"It's a very innovative preschool because roughly half the kids have autism and half are typically developing students," said CEO Daniel Openden, of Southwest Autism Research and Resource Center.

Daniel said typically developing students can benefit as much as those with autism because at preschool age, language skills are considered paramount to future learning whether the student has autism, or not.

"If you think about autism as a social disorder, it doesn't make sense to take kids with autism and put them only around other kids with autism," he commented. "So, they are getting the advantage of interacting with and learning from their typically developing peers."

He added, students with autism, some of whom are completely nonverbal, can gain the knowledge they need to begin speaking, and those without the disorder develop strong language skills at a critical age. All the classes are taught by teachers who specialize in autism education.

Daniel said the preschool, the fifth of nine planned SARRC campuses to be opened across the Valley eventually, is also focused on the bigger community since kids with autism and those without will be peers, classmates, teammates, and co-workers and employers in the future,

He added that learning to interact with kids who have different skills at a young age is a benefit to the kids themselves, and the community at large.

To encourage people to enroll their preschoolers and overcome any skepticism, Daniel said SARRC also



makes financial incentives and all-day care available for the parents of typically developing students to encourage them to enroll.

He said the student-teacher ratio at the SARRC Mesa preschool campus is in the range of one teacher to every three to four kids in the classroom, compared to one teacher for between seven and 10 students in a standard preschool setting.

"We will encounter some of that initial resistance until those parents of typically developing kids come toward the school and once they see it, they're like, "Oh my gosh, I'm putting my kid in here." Between the price and the number of teachers in the classroom and the number of people that are trying to elicit language, it kind of sells itself once we can get them in the door to take a look at it,"

American timepiece manufacturer FTS USA partners with SARRC to hire and train teens and adults with autism and introduce them to the mainstream Arizona workforce at FTS' Mesa manufacturing location.

"Crafting exceptional products and empowering the American workforce by nurturing skillful artisans, fostering valuable expertise, and cultivating versatile skill



sets for a brighter industrial landscape in the United States of America," FTS says on its website.

The Northeast Mesa SARRC preschool campus is part of a larger, strategic plan launched in 2019 to expand its services for students with autism across the Valley. The preschool is near Mesa Community College, Red Mountain Campus.

"SAARC's vision is people with autism meaningfully integrated into inclusive communities," Daniel said. "Within that, all of those pieces have meaning. We serve people across the lifespan. We want people, kids, teens, and adults with autism to be meaningfully integrated into their communities, whether in general education classrooms, going to summer camp, playing Little League, dance class, gymnastics or anything else."

Daniel said SARRC hopes to partner and build community relationships with schools, businesses, city officials, and social service agencies close to the Northeast Mesa campus as it seeks to be more visible in the Valley and expand its reach. ■

Medicare Supplemental Insurance is Different

Recently, I received an email from a gal that I helped enroll in a Medicare



Supplement plan a few years ago.

She was frustrated that her plan premium was increasing almost \$50 per month starting in April. This situation caused me to think that this would be a great subject to discuss in this article.

Medicare Supplemental insurance is different from Medicare Advantage plans. Supplemental insurance is something you purchase through a monthly premium. It does not have networks or many of the restrictions that some of the advantage plans have.

Someone might choose a supplement plan if they did not want to be bound by counties or state networks. When you have a supplement, you can go to any medical facility that accepts original Medicare.

One thing most people don't know is that with supplemental insurance, for example a plan F or plan G, you are able to apply for a different company at any time. Open enrollment only applies to Drug plans (Part D) and Advantage plans (Part C).

My answer to the email was, let's meet and see if you qualify for a different company and check the rates. If you have a supplement plan and wonder if you can get a better rate, feel free to call me. If you are in good health, the answer is usually yes.

It never hurts to check and see what is available to you. If you call me, I will ask some questions over the phone that will enable us to decide if there may be a better option for you.

Please remember, you can make an appointment if you are about to enter the Medicare world or have questions about your situation. I would love to be your guide.




